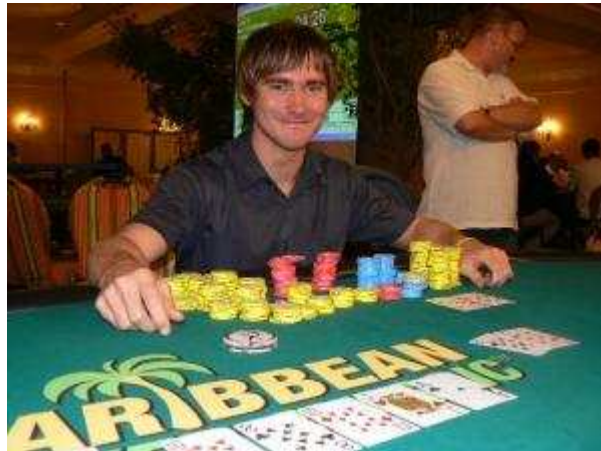

In the hold'em event, we have tournament director Thomas Kremser as one of the players. Heck, he even *looks* like one of the players, complete with latest-fashion jeans, trendy sunglasses and an I-pod. With the blinds at 150-300 and a 25 ante, he is still below 10K, as is the case with former World Champion Robert Varkonyi.

Right from the start of this final table, it was Jan Dahl from Sweden who continued to increase his already commanding chip lead. Dahl was playing his third final table this week, meaning that just like Paul Zimble he has shown a high level of consistency. He also had a fair share of luck, making a move from under the gun with a 9♥ 8♥, only to beat big blind Jeppe Mikkelsen's 88 by rivering a nine. And he actually got handed over chips when after a reraise from Jan with what turned out to be AA, Engin Husan decided to come over the top for all his money with a Q♠ 8♠. Of course, not a bad move from Engin by any means, but it was a rather unfortunate one in this case now that Jan had the bullets. And when going into the heads up stage, Jan couldn't complain about bad fortune either. Heads up against Willie Tann, it was the Singapore-born who had T7 on a TT8 flop and decided to check it back, in order to set a trap for his Swedish opponent. In the end, it would turn out to be a costly trap for Tann, as the turn J gave Jan's 97 a straight. The Swede check-raised all-in, and Willie called - but found no help on the river.

The Omaha event has started with four tables, around 34 players or so. And as is customary with PLO events: The fields are usually small, but very tough. For instance, Omaha specialists like Dave Colclough, Nick Gibson & Richard Ashby are in - and I can assure you, these are not the players you want to meet in a PLO competition. In a strong-but-small field (33 entrants), it was "Marbella Kid" Paul Zimbler who had a commanding chiplead early on. But after Richard Ashby had been eliminated on the bubble (only five placed paid), Paul lost a big pot to Yucel Eminoglu. When three players remained, in a situation where the chip stacks were not that far apart, it was decided to just make a deal. Everyone got around \$3K, but if my information is correct, both Paul and chipleader Yucel got slightly more than Kalle.
