CHIP POSITIONS AT START OF FINAL TABLE PLAY IN THE \$300+\$30 NL HOLD'EM EVENT



**No Limit Hold'em \$300+\$30
Sunday, November 27th 2pm

The tournament started at 2:00pm local time and the final table was not reached until 4:00am. We had two and a half hours of final table aggressive action. When the blinds moved up to 3K-6K with a 500 ante, everyone was basically short stacked, the luck factor became very high and casualties soon followed. Tony Chapman doubled up in a remarkable manner. All-in preflop for 31K with king-queen, he stared into the Two Eyes of Texas: AA for Torben Reinke. One queen on the board though, then the second one that Tony needed so desperately, and then even a third one... for quad queens to not just stay alive, but to have well over 20% of the total chips in play.

And with the blinds this high, things became a clear move-in contest. First, Torben Reinke busted out in sixth place against his fellow countryman Per Ravn. Then, Simon Hansson managed to survive with AJ versus Chapman's pocket sevens, an ace on the turn. And he survived once more with AT versus A 4 . Despite two clubs on the flop and a four on the turn, he stayed alive by catching a non-club ten on the river. With Simon back at 60K, it was then Lars Ringgaard's turn to stay alive in a somewhat lucky manner. Reraising all-in from the small blind with an A9, button Tony Barrett had a real hand: KK. But an ace flopped to give Lars a huge pot, and the now extremely shortstacked Tony was out two hands later.

We were then down to four! In the biggest pot of the tournament until now, three players got all of their chips in before the flop: Trond with a K4, Gunnar with the A♥ Q♥ and Lars with JJ. Gunnar had more chips than both other players, and on the turn he was still in good shape with a board T85Q. But a jack on the river brought all the chips to Lars Ringgaard, his three jacks earning him a 120K+ pot. The severely crippled Gunnar busted out on the immediate next hand.

A deal then was made between the three remaining players, Tony receiving first place honors for having the most chips. Official results:

- 4. Lars Ringgaard (Denmark) \$2,550
- 3. Simon Hansson (Sweden) \$3,990
- 2. Per Ravn (Denmark) \$8,070
- 1. Tony Chapman (England) \$16,050

Former chipleader Lars was then finished off by Tony Chapman, who had just stayed alive himself, his A2 all-in before the flop winning uncontested. And with Lars out, Tony managed to win another pot, meaning that in no-time he went from scratch to being the chipleader.

The third tournament at the Caribbean Poker Classic is over! In a raised pot, Lars Ringgaard made a gutsy call for 70K with 88 on the flop J♣ 9♣ 6♥, thinking that Per Ravn could very well be pushing a draw. But Per wasn't: He had QJ for a better made hand - and that held up.
